Please submit your poster abstract on the Conference website: <http://texasbst.tamu.edu/2012-conference/> by **January 27, 2012**. Poster submissions will be reviewed and participants will be notified of the outcome of selection by February 10, 2012. At least one author must be registered for the Conference by January 27, 2012.

Poster Content Requirements

Posters should present an overview of bacterial source tracking research. The poster should include a description of the research or program, process and methods, resources, evaluation and outcomes, and contact information. Photos and other illustrations may be used.

Poster Guidelines

Posters must be no larger than 36 inches wide by 46 inches long. Please print your poster on glossy paper. We will provide push pins to adhere to bulletin strips surrounding the conference room.

Electronic poster presentations must be e-mailed by February 22 to courtneysmith@tamu.edu. Copies will be made for conference participants with poster abstract.

Abstract Guidelines

Please include the following information:

Poster Title

Author's Name, optional title or degree

Affiliation, Address, e-mail

Next Author (repeat for each author)

Affiliation, Address, e-mail

Abstract

Please include a description of the research or program, process and methods, resources, evaluation and outcomes, and contact information.

The abstract should be no more than 250 words long. Please use Times New Roman 12 pt.

Keywords: List both specific and general terms that will aid in searches.
